Threat Assessment and Management Strategies for Electronic Communications

Presenters: Mario Scalora and Brian Spitzberg



Dr. Mario Scalora currently serves as Director of the University of Nebraska Public Policy Center and is a Professor of Psychology at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. He leads the Targeted Violence Research Team supervising research regarding threat assessment and management, violent extremism, school violence, as well as workplace violence. Dr. Scalora has extensive background as a consultant to various law enforcement agencies at the local, state and federal levels. He currently serves as the consulting psychologist to the Threat Assessment Unit of the United States Capitol Police--assisting with case consultation and research activity related to threatening activity toward Members of Congress. He also serves as the threat assessment consultant with the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Police. Dr. Scalora also serves as a consultant to additional law enforcement agencies as well as corporations regarding threat assessment and management.

Dr. Brian H. Spitzberg (PhD, CTM) is Senate Distinguished Professor Emeritus in the School of Communication at San Diego State University. He is a core Researcher, Center for Communication, Health, & the Public Good, and a Co-founder & Advisory Board member, Center for Human Dynamics in the Mobile Age, SDSU. He received the 2009 Western States Communication Association Scholar Award, the 2011 National Communication Association Larry Kibler Memorial Award, and the 2017 Mark Knapp NCA Award for career contribution to the study of Interpersonal Communication. His coauthored book *The Dark Side of Relationship Pursuit: From Attraction to Obsession and Stalking* won both the biennial International Association for Relationship Research Book Award (1st ed.: 2008) and the NCA Gerald Miller book award (2nd ed., 2015). He is author or coauthor of over 160 scholarly articles and book chapters, cited over 14,000 times. He has coauthored and co-edited several scholarly books on communication competence and the dark side of communication.
